#### **MENTORING - New for 2013**

What is it? Following a very successful two year pilot at The Pony Club Tetrathlon Championships, The Pony Club is expanding to include its Championship disciplines of Show Jumping, Dressage and Eventing. Its aim is to help and support Members and associates to perform at their best when it counts. Current and former elite riders have been carefully selected to be your 2013 Pony Club Mentors. They are available throughout The Pony Club Championships at Cholmondeley to chat informally to competitors about their competition and to go through the four mentor cards.

How does it work? NFU Mutual Pony Club Mentoring is designed to run alongside the competition. The mentors can be approached by competitors at any time during the competition including evenings to go through the mentor cards. Upon completion of each card, you will receive a wristband – there are 4 different colours to collect: Gold, light blue, blue and purple.

The mentor cards are designed to be completed individually or in groups with your mentor and can take anything from minutes to as long as you want. The content of the mentor cards include (1) Winning habits; (2) Working with nerves; (3) Working through setbacks; (4) Being best prepared

Your mentors can be spotted around each Championship venue or at the mentor tent in the trade stand area in their Pony Club Mentor kit. Grab them to talk to or they can come and find you.

## **MEMBERSHIP RENEWAL FORMS for 2014 - Reminder**

### **TRAINING**

#### **Requirements for Coaches and Instructors**

Following feedback from a number of Branches the requirements for coaches and instructors have been amended so that all Branches, Centres and Areas will be able to cover all the usual activities for the education and fun of our Members. The enclosed paper summarises these new requirements. They will come into force on 1st January, 2014. The Training Committee's original wish list is still ultimately the goal for best practice and we would encourage all of you who can to get as many of your coaches and instructors fully accredited.

#### Dengie Winter League Dressage 2013/2014

#### Rule Book - Protests and Objections

The following paragraph has been omitted from the end of Rule 47 of the Dressage Rule Book:

"Should a breach of eligibility subsequently be discovered, then the Discipline Committee may disqualify the offending team or individual. If said individual was a Member of a qualifying team and their score contributed to the qualification the team will be disqualified unless the qualification holds up using the discard score."

## DRESSAGE TO MUSIC

The Freestyle Dressage to Music Competition, generously sponsored by The Worshipful Company of Loriners, will be held at the Championships at Cholmondeley Castle. As in previous years, direct entry is permitted; riders are not expected to qualify at Area Competitions. The Competition will be split over two days with Open and Intermediate Individuals on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> August and Novice Individuals, Associates, Pairs, Family Pairs and the Individual Ride-Off on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> August.

#### **JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS**



#### **Correct Helmets**

Some polo playing Members wear polo specific helmets, please ensure that these also meet the required minimum standard. It is mandatory for all Members to wear a protective helmet manufactured to one of the minimum standards listed in the back of The Pony Club Polo Rule Book. It must bear the CE mark and a quality symbol; either the BSI Kitemark, the SAI Global symbol, the official Snell label with number or the NOCSAE certificate. The CE symbol on its own is not sufficient to ensure consistent standard of manufacture.




#### Championships

Entry Form 'A' will need to reach me no later than 26th July and Entry Form 'B' no later than 2<sup>nd</sup> August as the Order of Play will need to be done a week before the Championships. A reminder for Class 1 on Entry Form A - all Members **must** be from the same Branch or Centre, 3 Seniors and 3 Juniors.

All players must be active Members of the stated Branch or Centre who have participated at a minimum of three working rallies of this or their previous Branch or Centre since 1<sup>st</sup> July of the previous year, excluding team practices and coaching, and should have been Members of The Pony Club since at least the 31<sup>st</sup> January in the current year, except for Members who are completely new to The Pony Club, who may join up until the 31<sup>st</sup> March and still be eligible for Area Competitions and the Championships. Attendance at camp counts as one working rally. All Branches and Centres must have attended a Regional Tournament. Ponies must have genuinely participated at a minimum of three working rallies since 1<sup>st</sup> July in the previous year with a Member of The Pony Club, one of which must have been in the current year.

Each Branch or Centre must secure the services of one umpire and one horse for the Championships which must be filled in on Entry Form 'B'.

## **HEALTH AND SAFETY**

#### **Risk Assessments**

A risk assessment must be carried out and recorded for all Pony Club activities and should be signed and dated for each event, even if the same venue is used.

To use a previous risk assessment is not acceptable for insurance purposes.

#### Disclosure & Barring Service (DBS) Application Forms

Please make sure you read the instructions carefully before completing the DBS forms as Sections X & Y are still being filled in. These Sections are for BHS only as they are the registered body. Only Sections A, B, C and E should be completed, in BLACK ink and BLOCK CAPITALS. The person checking identity documents, e.g. driving licence, passport, birth certificate, utility bill, etc, to complete <u>Section W only</u> on the back page. All cheques to be made payable to **The British Horse Society** and <u>NOT</u> The Pony Club.

All forms <u>must</u> be returned to The Pony Club Office for checking and recording. <u>Do not</u> send forms to the British Horse Society or the Disclosure & Barring Service.

If you are in possession of any of the old forms that have the letters CRB in the top right hand corner please destroy these as they are now obsolete. #### Volunteers Information on the Internet

Please do make sure that when including your volunteer's details, such as home addresses, phone numbers and email addresses, in online space that is shared (E.g. on web pages and documents hosted on web pages not the PCUKMAP) that volunteers are happy for this information to be displayed and understand that until the documents or information on the web pages is removed their details will be available to anyone who searches for them online.

#### **Stirrups**

Please ask your tack checkers to ensure that stirrups and boots are correct. Our rules require:"Standard riding or jodhpur boots with a fairly smooth, thin sole and a well defined square cut
heel" and "Stirrups should be of the correct size to suit the rider's boots. They must have 7mm
(1/4 inch) clearance on either side of the boot".

These rules together with the requirement not to wear other unsuitable footwear, including boots and stirrups with interlocking treads, are there to minimise the risk of the foot becoming caught in the stirrup in a fall which can cause very serious injuries. It is worthwhile reminding parents that when they buy new jodhpur boots for their children to check the size of their stirrups with the new boots.

Changes to the Dress Section of the Health &Safety Rule Book for 2014 have been agreed as below:

#### a. Hats

The Pony Club rule for riding hats is given in Appendix G. This rule defines the quality of manufacture that is required with proof that batches of finished hats are sampled and tested before being delivered to retailers. The individual disciplines also have additional requirements with regard to colour and type. It is strongly recommended that second hand hats are not purchased.

Hats must be worn at all times when mounted with a chinstrap fastened and adjusted so as to prevent movement of the hat in the event of a fall.

#### **b. Body Protectors**

The Pony Club does not make the use of body protectors compulsory, except for all cross country riding and Pony Racing whether it be training or competing. For general use, the responsibility for choosing body protectors and the decision as to their use must rest with members and their parents. It is recommended that a rider's body protector should not be more than 2% of their body weight. When worn, body protectors must fit correctly, be comfortable and must not restrict movement.

Level 2 body protectors are designed to provide a level of protection that is considered appropriate for use in low risk situations. These do not include riding on roads or other hard surfaces and riding young or excitable horses.

Level 3 body protectors are designed to provide a level of protection that is considered appropriate for normal riding including competition and working with horses.

Riders who choose to use the Woof Wear Body Cage EXO must lodge a key with the Event Organiser when they collect their number.

#### Air Jackets

Air jackets are not recommended for use other than for cross country riding. When an air jacket inflates the sudden noise startles horses in the immediate vicinity thereby causing difficulties for the other members of a ride if used for a group ride in a confined area, e.g. an indoor school or outdoor ménage, air jackets are therefore discouraged for group rides.

If a rider chooses to wear an air jacket it must only be used in addition to a normal body protector. Parents and Members must be aware that riders may be permitted to continue after a fall in both competition and training rides. In the event of a fall, it must be fully deflated or removed before continuing, the conventional body protector will continue to give protection. Air jackets must not be worn under a jacket and number bibs should be fitted loosely or with elasticated fastenings over the air jacket.
