- 1. All WL Classes will be run under Pony Club Show Jumping Rules 2021 and in accordance with Area 5 Winter League Rules August 2020, over a single phase course with two sections (see below).
- 2. Points will be awarded in accordance with Area 5 Winter League Rules.
- 3. Branches entering more than one team in any one Class must name all teams and clearly identify their Winter League Team.
- 4. Class 3Q, 4Q and 5Q. Barrier Animal Health Spring Festival Debut, PC Challenge and Open Grand Prix Classes will run in accordance with The Pony Club Show Jumping Rules 2022 and The Pony Club Spring Festival Show Jumping Rules 2022. To be judged under BS Table A7.
- 5. Members who had qualified for the cancelled 2021 Spring Festival Area Competitions (and are recorded with the Office) will keep their places for the 2022 Spring Festival Area Competitions.
- 6. Ages as at 1st January 2021.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

1. Rosettes Team and Individual rosettes to 6th in WL Classes 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. Individual rosettes to 6th in SF Classes 3Q, 4Q and 5Q.

Team and Individual rosettes to 6th for Area 5 Winter League Show Jumping Series in Classes 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5. Sashes for overall Winners and a trophy for the Winning Team.

- 2. Saddlery and Dress Pony Club Saddlery and Dress Rules apply.
- **3. Numbers** Members must print their own numbers.
- **4. Muck** Please **do not** muck out horseboxes in the car park. There are dedicated muck skips, please use them. Please **do not** put muck in litter bins.
- **5. Litter** Please put litter in the bins provided or take it home with you. Please **do not** put litter in the muck skips.
- 6. Café Kelsall have a café, which serves hot and cold refreshments.
- **7.** Horses/Ponies Must not be tied up to the outside of horseboxes/trailers and left unattended. No haynets please tied to the outside of horseboxes.
- 8. Accidents All accidents must be reported to the Organiser.

1. The Pony Club Spring Festival Debut and PC Challenge Show Jumping Rules

Summary (Please familiarise yourselves with the Pony Club Spring Festival Rules)

There are three stages to this competition:

- 1. Preliminary Rounds, which are held throughout the country between April and March to enable competitors to qualify for their Area Competition. Members who qualify must have jumped a clear round in the first round or first phase, if run under single or two phase. The first four (or more dependent upon number of entries) will be awarded rosettes and qualify to go forward to their Area Competition.
- 2. Area competitions will be held March for those who qualified at Preliminary Round.
- 3. Those successful at the Area competition will go forward to the Championships.

2. Debut Eligibility: Combination of horse/pony and rider are NOT eligible if they have:

- represented their Branch/Centre at Intermediate (PC100) or above at Summer Area Qualifiers for The Pony Club Show Jumping Championships.
- ever been played 1st 3rd as an INDIVIDUAL in the Novice (PC90) or above Pony Club Show Jumping Championships.

Rider NOT eligible if they have:

- · competed at the Winter Series Open Grand Prix Championships or
- The Pony Club Show Jumping Final at Hickstead.

3. Numbers To Qualify

Qualification at Area Qualifiers will work on a ratio basis as below

Debut and PC Challenge

Number of competitors starting the competition	Number of competitors to qualify (plus any tying for these places)
0 – 50	7
51 – 60	8
61 – 70	9
And pro rata	

Open Grand Prix

The first FOUR will qualify for the Championships from each Area Qualifier. If there are more than 15 starters, then FIVE will qualify. (Any combination eliminated or retired in round one will NOT qualify.)

4. Passing Down The Qualification

On The Day If a competitor is unable to go to the Championships then the qualifying places will be passed down the line. Please ensure every competitor confirms to the organiser/steward that they are intending to enter the Championships.

After the Area Qualifier If a competitor is unable to go to the Championships, they must notify the Pony Club Office as soon as possible so that their qualifying place can be passed down the line. This will only be done up until five days prior to the Championships.

5. Equine Influenza Vaccine Compliance

Please ensure you bring your horse's/pony's record and proof of vaccination with you.
